

Over five lakh tourists visited Puducherry in three days preceding New Year, says CM

Puducherry's popularity as a preferred tourist destination is evinced by the data which shows that an estimated 5 lakh visitors converged in the city in the three days preceding New Year celebrations, Chief Minister N. Rangasamy has said.

Inaugurating the 31st International Yoga Festival, 2026 at the Gandhi Thidal, the Chief Minister said Puducherry remained popular as a naturally charming, heritage-rich and peaceful place. The government has been hosting diverse cultural programmes throughout the year to entertain visitors and the yoga festival was one such event, he added.

Mr. Rangasamy announced that a 10-day exhibition showcasing va-

rious departments and featuring cultural programmes would be held from February 10.

Speaker R. Selvam, Minister for Public Works and Tourism K. Lakshminarayanan, D. Manikandan, Secretary (Tourism), Vishnutharan Kalimuthu, an of-

ficial from the Malaysian Embassy, and M. Mathew Francis, Director (in-charge) of Tourism participated.

The inaugural event featured a drone show, folk music, and various cultural performances.

Over 1,200 participants

from various states of India and abroad are participating in the festival.

A press note said the Puducherry government, through its Department of Tourism, has been hosting the International Yoga Festival every year from January 4 to 7 since 1993, de-

signing the event not just as a celebration, but as a platform that reflects the essence of yoga and contributes to physical, mental, and spiritual well-being.

Promoting tourism

The festival's emphasis is on promoting tourism while also ensuring the physical and mental health of the people.

The 31st edition features various yoga competitions for men and women of different age groups, workshops, and demonstrations of various traditional yoga practices led by expert instructors at the Convention Centre located in the Old Port complex.

Special cultural programmes and mass yoga events will be held at Gandhi Thidal on the Beach Road. A highlight will be the awarding of the title of male/female champion of the yoga competitions.

Home Minister hints at government's plan to provide cash for Pongal

Home Minister A. Namassivayam on Monday hinted at the government's plan to provide cash to ration cardholders as Pongal gift in the Union Territory.

"The Chief Minister will make an announcement on the subject. The BJP has also requested Chief Minister to consider giving cash to ration cardholders as Pongal assistance," he said in reply to a query at a press conference.

He was responding to a question on whether the AINRC-BJP government has plans to provide cash to ration cardholders as Pongal assistance like the ruling DMK announced in Tamil Nadu.

Meanwhile, the government on Monday started distribution of a kit con-

taining five grocery items with a bag free of cost to card holders as Pongal gift.

Around 3.47 lakh ration cardholders in the four regions of the Union Territory will get the kit containing rice (4kg), Naatu Sakkarai (1 kg), Moong Dal (1 kg), Sunflower Oil (1 litre) and Ghee (300 gm). The Public Distribution System

(PDS) outlets will start distributing the kit in other places soon.

Chief Minister N. Rangasamy inaugurated the distribution at a PDS outlet in Thilaspeth.

Speaker R. Selvam, Minister for Public Works K. Lakshminarayanan, legislators and officials attended the event.
